CHIEF'S REPORT

November 7, 2023

Department Business:

C-Shift Community Feedback: Received an update from early November patient, wanting to Thank and Meet the crew that saved his life.

The Administration has started the process of rebuilding our personnel policy manual. We have obtained a draft copy from SDAO and HR answers. We are using this as the foundation and using our previous manual to produce an updated modern manual.

The final draft of the Civil Service rules has been approved by our legal counsel and will be finalized during the next Civil Service Commission Meeting.

Active 911 update: Working with active 911 we imported our hydrant flow data, pre-fire plans, Community AED locations and bridge access limitations in their mapping software. We have also been able to share this information with all our response partners excluding CFD (In progress). We are no longer required to pay the licensing fee for our past mapping software, a cost savings of approximately \$2,500.

Grants:

FEMA SAFER- It does not appear that we were successful in the SAFER grant process to fund staff. We are scheduling a meeting with a FEMA Grant Specialist to review our results and seek improvement. Grant feedback will be available at or around last week of November.

Fire House Subs- We applied for a grant to fully fund the cost of a 4-seat tracked John Deer Gator. This would be used as a Rescue Vehicle to gain access to patients in austere environments. The primary purpose would be access to patients located on Mary's peak during the snowpack.

FEMA Assistant to Firefighters Grant (AFG)- All Benton County Fire Agencies have agreed to apply for a regional AFG grant to fund multi band radios.

2023 OSFM Wildfire Season Staffing Grant- Completed our funding period and will retain close to \$5,830 to utilize next year of the \$35,000 grant for upstaffing during Wildfire Season.

3 Potential Volunteer Firefighters have applied for positions and are currently in the background process. We will be hosting a Firefighter I Academy with an anticipated start date of the second week of January and ending early May.

Training Activities:

4 of our Company Officers will be attending the Oregon State Fire Marshals Company Inspection Training Program. Once completed all officers will be qualified to inspect local mercantile type structures.

The focus on training has been on structure fire attack, focusing on deployment and use of our new 2-inch hose package.

5 members completed Pediatric Advanced Life Support Certification.

Apparatus/Equipment:

Apparatus pump testing has been completed on all apparatus except engine 231. Pump testing is a long tedious process that normally takes 3 to 4 hours per apparatus.

Building Update:

203 Generator Update- The Generator from CFD has been sold at the price it was purchased. We took delivery of a Generac 26 KW generator with transfer switch last week. The propane tank has been ordered, we have gone to the county and started the permit process. We are working with the electrician to schedule the date for installation.

The electronic reader board should be delivered within the next week. We are working with the city to obtain a permit for the placement of the sign. The sign will be housed in a "timber town" designed structure.

The Exhaust System at Station 203 repair has been completed by volunteer staff members. A huge thanks to Andy Louden, Dan Kearl, and Chris Leonard for taking on this project!
